Indianapolis Ranking Order

Projects are grouped according to program type (PSH, SH, and TH) and are ranked according to the yearly average score. The Indianapolis CoC has committed to align with HUD priorities to rank permanent supportive housing projects higher than safe haven and transitional housing renewal projects, with the exception of low-scoring permanent supportive housing projects. Because the primary basis for scoring renewal proposals is performance data from the Annual Performance Reports (APRs), first time renewal projects which have not been operating long enough to have a year of performance data can't be scored, these projects are ranked below the renewal PSH projects, but above safe haven and transitional renewal projects.

Project Ranking Order:

1. Renewal permanent supportive housing (PSH) projects scoring between 100-80 points (high performance)
2. First Time Renewal PSH and RRH projects not operating long enough to have a year of performance data
3. Renewal safe haven (SH)
4. Renewal HMIS
5. Renewal transitional housing (TH) targeting HUD's three priority populations – domestic violence, substance abuse and youth
6. New supportive services only (SSO) project created thru reallocation
7. New permanent supportive housing (PSH) projects created thru reallocation
8. New rapid re-housing (RRH) project created thru reallocation
9. New HMIS created thru reallocation
10. New PSH created thru bonus money
11. New RRH created thru bonus money
12. PSH renewal – scoring 79 or below: low performing
13. RRH renewal – scoring 79 or below: low performing
14. TH renewal – scoring 79 or below: low performing
