# Why Revise the Ranking and Review Process?

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- Need to House More People Experiencing Homelessness
- How Can We Make that Happen?
  - Need More Money from HUD CoC Award Competition
  - Must Improve Our CoC Score
  - Better Aligned with HUD Priorities
  - Must Use the Latest NOFA to Align Priorities
    - Ranking and Review Must Take Place After the NOFA has been Announced

# HUD Description of Ranking and Review – Taken from 2015 NOFA

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- ❑ Coordinated, Inclusive and Outcome-Oriented Process
- ❑ Established Objective Criteria
- ❑ Public Process with Written Policies and Procedures
- ❑ Must Have Monitored Renewing Projects:
  - Utilization Rates
  - Increasing Housing Stability
  - Participant Eligibility
  - Length of Time Homeless
  - Destination upon Program Exit
  - Increasing Participant Income
  - Connecting Participants to Mainstream Benefits

# Indianapolis Scoring Report

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- The Seven Categories Used Last Year are Consistent with other CoC's:
  - Housing Stability (PSH and RRH)
  - Exit to Permanent Housing (TH)
  - Non-Employment Income
  - Employment
  - Mainstream Benefits
  - Chronic Homelessness
  - Homeless Families
  - Draw Down Rate



# Additional Categories Under Consideration

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- Housing First
  - Criteria for each Project Type
- Leverage
- HMIS Data Quality and Completeness
- Utilization Rate

# Key Changes Being Considered

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- Ranking and Review Will NOT Take Place in May and June
  - Coincide with the NOFA Announcement
- Ranking and Review will be Based on Objective, Publicly Available Criteria
  - No Presentations
- Quarterly Reports Based on the Objective Criteria will be Published and Disseminated
  - Run Pilot Test to insure Quality

# New Projects in 2016 and Beyond

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- ❑ Need Organizations that are Willing and Able to Take on New Projects in the 2016 CoC Application
- ❑ Need Landlords Willing and Able to House CoC Clients
- ❑ Need Developers Willing and Able to Build, Develop and/or Remodel Buildings for CoC Clients

# Opportunity for New Projects

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- Coburn Place – just Awarded New Project
- HIP – may be Awarded their New Project
- Bonus Project 2016
  - Assume the same as 2015 \$870,000
- Reallocation from Returned Funds \$300,000
- Boner Center – 13 Family Units
- Renewing Projects may Increase Units
  - Damien Center and Englewood

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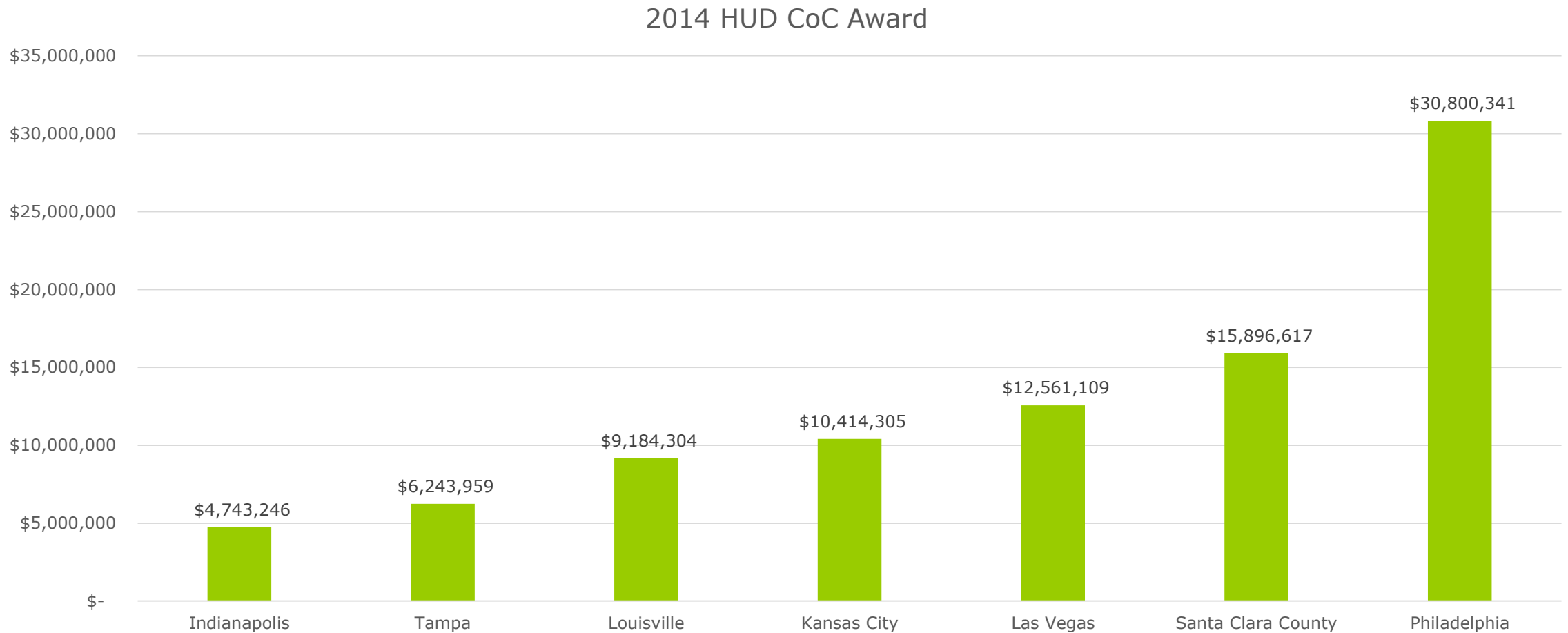
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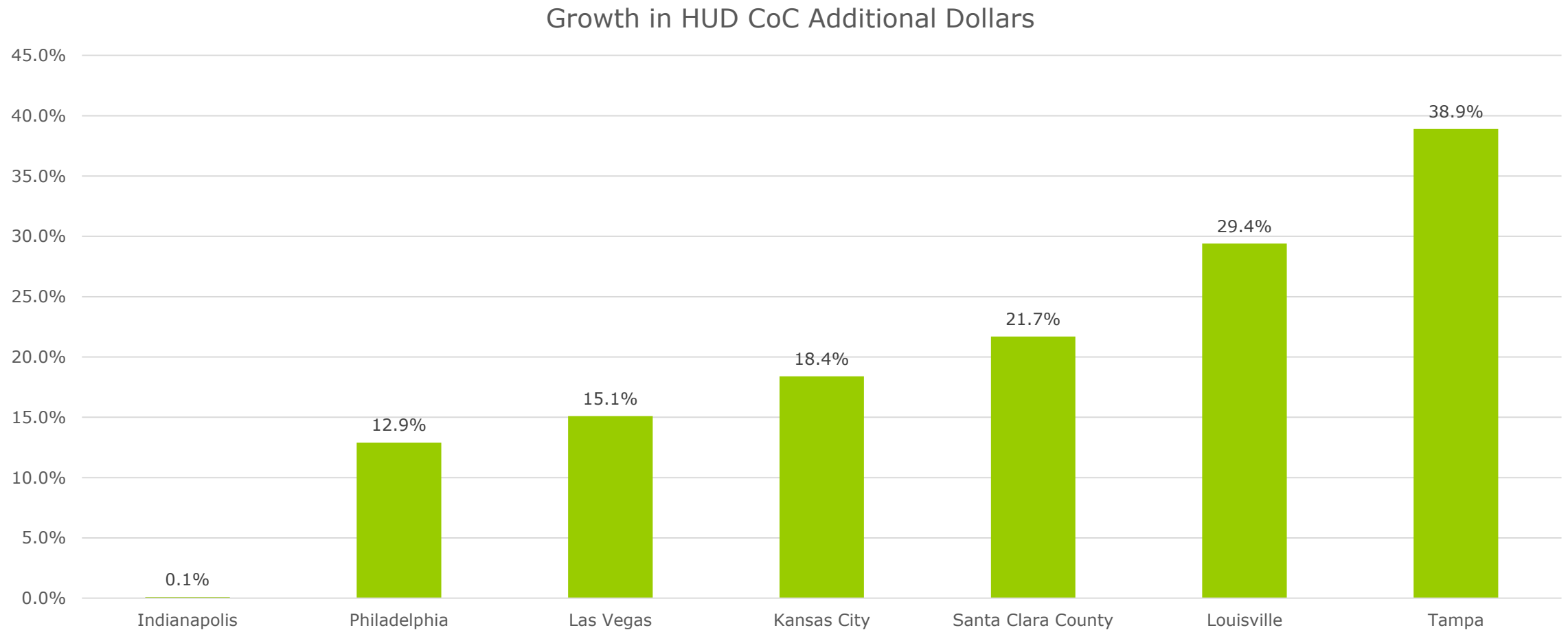
